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## **Attendance and Progress**

It has been great to see very high levels of attendance since we fully reopened. The children have enjoyed returning to the routine of school and have settled back into their classes well. Every day in the school building is important and never more so than the days which lie ahead in the summer term.

Regular attendance will give the adults supporting your child the best chance of assessing and supporting their progress along with preparing them well for their move into a new year group (or school) in September. Let's keep the collective effort going.

#### Parents' Evenings

We would usually hold these in March but given we have had a mix of children learning at home and on site in recent months, we wanted to give all children plenty of time to settle back into normal classroom life so we could collect information about how they are doing. In this way we can provide information to you which will be of value.

We will be holding virtual parents' evenings during the week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> May and details about these will follow early next term. In addition, we will provide the annual report as usual in July and together they will give you a good sense of your child's progress, achievements and areas for development as thoughts turn towards next year.

# **Online Safety**

In recent months, many children have spent far more time online than they would usually and we have noticed an increase in some pupils accessing inappropriate video games and potentially unsafe content at home.

Make sure your child's online activity is monitored closely, especially the appropriateness of the material they are accessing, the games they are playing and the people who they are engaging with online. ## Safeguarding

The school takes its safeguarding duty very seriously and if you have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you must contact the school or the Birmingham Children's Advice Service on 0121-303-1888 in confidence.

This number must also be used if you suspect any unlawful or inappropriate contact has taken place with either your child (or other children) online.

#### **ACCESS TO COVID-19 HOME TESTING KITS**

Parents/carers of school-aged pupils are now able to access Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing free of charge.

There are two ways for households to get LFD home testing kits:

- 1. Collect boxes of LFD home testing kits from several locations around the city.
- a. Collection locations can be found on the site finder tool here: <a href="https://find-covid-19-rapidtest-sites.maps.test-and-trace.nhs.uk/">https://find-covid-19-rapidtest-sites.maps.test-and-trace.nhs.uk/</a>.
- b. Details of opening times for LFD kits collection at each location are on the site finder tool. LFD home test kit collection times are in the afternoons. Please note that the locations operate in the mornings as symptomatic PCR test sites.
- c. Parents and family members of pupils who attend Birmingham schools, and staff who provide support services to schools (catering staff, school transport drivers, etc) can visit any of these locations, without an appointment and collect up to a maximum of 4 boxes of test kits for their household members.
- d. Each box contains 7 LFD home tests that should last one person about a month based on them testing themselves twice a week.

If as a parent you are testing regularly through work twice a week then you don't need to do additional testing and as more workplaces re-open, we expect businesses to be ensuring that staff returning to the workplace are regularly testing as part of their Covid-19 safety measures.

The results of your test need to be registered on-line or by calling 119: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result or by calling 119.
