

Knitting For All-Kids Knit club

An exciting new creative club, 'Kids Knit', is starting here at St. Mary's this Autumn. This is open to children in Years One to Six. It is run by myself, Helen Livermore, and I run 'Knitting For All', Bournville and Selly Oak.

It is a professionally designed course that encourages children to progress quickly in their knitting skills, immediately building confidence and enthusiasm. Children work in small groups, using natural fibres and materials, on projects that are specific to their level of knitting. Your child will use chunky, colourful, easy to handle wool, to learn the basics of knitting, such as, casting on, knit and purl stitches and casting off. As they learn, they will knit items, such as gloves, animals, decorations, and much much more. As well as learning the skills, children are encouraged to adapt patterns if they so wish, devise their own, and have fun and get creative!

Your 'Kids Knit' club at St Marys will run on Mondays, from 30th September through to 31st October and then 11th November to 9th December, (please note there will be no club on the first Monday after half term, which is 4th November). 'Kids Knit' club is from 3.30-4.30pm.

The cost covers tuition and all materials used in the lesson. Your child will also receive a starter pack of a bag to carry projects/equipment, a set of chunky needles and a skills/sticker folder.

There is no need to bring any extra equipment, as everything is provided.
