# Spirituality at St Mary's:

PARAMY SCHOOL

At St Mary's we are very concerned with developing the **whole child**. Whilst academic success is very important to us, spiritual and character development is also a key priority.

What do we mean by 'spiritual development'? We know that our diverse community is made up of children from many faith backgrounds and also those without a particular faith. Our belief is that our children's spiritual development is linked to their inner beliefs, values, interactions within their community and their relationships with others and the earth.

**How do we develop spiritually?** At St Mary's, we use our curriculum to provide multiple opportunities to explore spirituality through the metaphor of Windows, Mirrors and Doors. We encourage our children to: 'Look out into the world' (Windows); 'Reflect on how their learning impacts them' (Mirrors) and 'Make changes to how they will live in our school community and the world' (Doors).



As a Church of England school, our Governors are largely selected by the original foundation: the Church. It is our Governors' belief that St Mary's School was created to serve the immediate community and that is what we do to this day. It is our ambition that all who enter St Mary's School feel welcome regardless of their faith or any other protective characteristic. The practices that we have, that are distinctly Christian are mainly within our worship. These are **inclusive**, **invitational and inspirational** times when we gather to reflect and for some, worship God. We invite families of all faiths and of none, to join us in school for Congratulations assemblies and at Church for services. When they do, we ask them to take part in as much or little as they feel comfortable with - our worship is always invitational.

All of our work is focussed on us meeting our vision of bringing out the best in each other so that all may know life in all its fullness.
