# **Winter Weather Procedures**

If severe weather strikes, the first step is to assume that the school is open unless you are informed otherwise. If we are closed, you will be informed by text message, school website, Twitter and e-mail by 7.15 at the latest and we will use the same methods to inform you of reopening arrangements. Local radio stations will be also be contacted.

If snow has fallen and the forecast is poor, we will have a 'rolling' closure where you can pick your child up from a specific time onwards if you are able to - we will let you know if this is happening through the same methods above.

Finally, we were very concerned with the lack of gritting (and facilities) on Lodge Hill and Frederick Road during the recent spell of snow and ice and have contacted the three Selly Oak Ward Councillors with our views on the risks and dangers this presents.

# **Key Stage Two Standards (2017)**

We have had final confirmation of our outcomes for this year's KS2 assessments which were carried out in July. The results are below with the 2017 national average in brackets for comparison.

Children achieving the expected and higher standard in each of Reading, EGPS\*, Writing and Maths:

Reading: 97% (72%) and 50% (25%)
 Writing: 93% (76%) and 20% (18%)

3) EGPS: 97% (77%) and 60% (31%)

4) Maths: 100% (75%) and 40% (23%)

\*English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling

# Children achieving the expected or higher standard in all of Reading, Writing and Maths:

5) Expected: 93% (61%)

<u>This was the second highest in Birmingham.</u>

6) Higher: 20% (9%)

# Notice for Year 2 Parents - Workshop in January

# **Advertising**

We receive regular requests from parents and other organisations to copy and distribute leaflets or flyers advertising different events or activities in the local community. We are happy to consider these but the logistics and cost of doing this would be significant if we were to grant every request, therefore we cannot offer this service. However, we are able to display adverts in the usual locations around the school (e.g. noticeboards) but ask that all requests are directed to the school office in the first instance.

#### **Behaviour Code**

It goes without saying that staff, visitors and volunteers should be conscious of their status as positive role models in and around school and, by extension, parents have a vital role to play in this regard. Unfortunately, we have had some isolated incidents in the recent months where a small minority of parents have fallen short of what is acceptable conduct and have set a poor example to our pupils.

This is something that is not confined to our school and Birmingham City Council have recently published a behaviour code for visitors and parents designed for use in its schools. The Governing Body decided to adopt this code last month and it specifies conduct that is deemed unacceptable along with the range of options open to the school should action be required. It has been sent alongside this newsletter today and will be effective from the start of January.

# **Forms/Certificates of Attendance**

The school has traditionally provided certificates to confirm a child's attendance at this school if parents request this. These are often used to assist with visa applications or support admission to schools overseas.

The volume of these requests has increased over the past year and the work required to produce a certificate adds to the volume of tasks that the school's administrative team have to complete. With this in mind, the school's governors have agreed that the school will now ask for a voluntary contribution (the amount being of the parents' choice) to school fund that recognises the work required and we hope that parents will be supportive of this.

Please be aware that staff cannot act as countersignatories for passport applications or anything similar as the personal data required is of a type that cannot be divulged due to the risk of it falling into the wrong hands and being misused.

#### Safeguarding
