# Site Safety - January 2021

The safety measures we have currently have in place will continue until further notice. A reminder of some key points for January.

# Symptoms

-Children must not be sent to school if they are showing symptoms of Covid-19. We encourage you to get them tested if this is the case and let us know the result.

-Children must not attend school while they are awaiting the result of a test.

-Children must not attend school if a member of the household has received a positive test result and other members of the household are required to self-isolate.

# Use of the site

-Make sure your child arrives at school on time and is collected on time. We have different drop off and collection times to limit the number of people gathering at any one time and to reduce the risk to others.

-If you are using the cube to travel from one side of the site to the other, please wear a face covering or cover your mouth and nose for the short time you are indoors. If you are unable to do this, use Lodge Hill Road and Frederick Road instead.

-If you are waiting to drop-off and/or collect, do not allow your child to mix with others who are not in your household.

-Use one way systems where they are marked.

# Contact details

If your contact details change during the Christmas break, let us know as soon as term begins. This means we can contact you quickly should we need to close your child's class.

Please refer to the letter sent on 9<sup>th</sup> December about contacting school if your child receives a positive test result for Covid-19 during the opening days of the Christmas break. This letter has been reissued with this newsletter.
