#### **Lockdown Procedures**

You received a letter on 3<sup>rd</sup> July outlining the school's use of these in the event of an emergency in or around the school. Advice issued by Birmingham LA last week now states that primary schools should go through procedures with staff but not with children so undue distress is avoided. We will now follow this advice and work closely with staff on the issue.

## **Key Stage Two Sats**

These benchmarks are used to help judge the effectiveness of a school and are published nationally in December. The tests are now far harder than those that were in place up until 2015 with the children having to demonstrate far more knowledge and understanding to be considered as working at the standard expected for their age. The figures for our school are below and they show the percentage of our children who achieved this standard with the provisional national figures in brackets. As you can see, our Year 6 children rose to the challenge magnificently.

**Reading:** 97% (71%)

**Grammar, Punctuation, Spelling:** 97% (77%)

Writing\*: 93% (76%)

\*This is teacher assessed and not tested.

Mathematics: 100% (75%)

Congratulations to the children and huge thanks to all of the staff who have been involved in teaching and supporting them during their seven years at the school.

## **Summer Projects/September Entry and Exit Points**

The school will embark on the final phase of its expansion from September as we head towards 420 pupils from September 2018. We will be making further improvements to the building and site in order this summer so we are prepared a year in advance:

- -The area outside the current Reception classrooms will be changed and landscaped to create a designated area for outdoor learning. In addition, a canopy is to be erected immediately outside these rooms to allow large sections of this new area to be used regardless of weather conditions.
- -The school will be taking possession of the Site Manager's house over the summer holiday and will convert this into a space allowing our current level of music tuition to be maintained as well as create working space for staff and meeting rooms.

The entry and exit points for classes from September onwards are explained below, these have been designed to minimise congestion in and around the school at the beginning and end of the day.

- -Reception and Year 1 classes remain unchanged.
- -Years 2 and 3 classes the entry/exit point for Eagles, Falcons and Hedgehogs classes will be the doorway next to the canopied area in the Lodge Hill Rd playground. Foxes will use the classroom door that leads onto this playground.
- -**Dolphins** and **Starfish** classrooms will be where the current Year 4 classes are and their entry/exit point will be the classroom doors that lead directly onto the Lodge Hill Rd playground.
- -Lions and Giraffes will move to where the current Year 5 classroom is based, their entry/exit point will be the one currently used by Years 5 and 6 (the stairwell leading onto the Lodge Hill Rd playground).
- -Tigers will move to the current Year 6 classroom at the opposite end of the corridor to where they are at the moment, their entry and exit will be the doorway by the spider-web climbing frame on the Frederick Road side of the site.

Looking forward to next summer, if your child is currently in Year 5 please note that the test week for the 2017 Year 6 Sats is the week beginning Monday 14<sup>th</sup> May.

#### **Year 6 Leavers' Service**

St Mary's Church can no longer accommodate all of the classes in the school in a single service and we now have two Church services at the end of each half-term for the Encourage and Inspire groups respectively.

Organising the forthcoming Leavers' service has provided a further challenge and we have considered the following principles when deciding a new format for this:

- -Our wish to provide the children with a special, unique service on their final morning.
- -The importance of enabling as many family members as possible to attend and for them to have an excellent view of the service.
- -The opportunity for siblings of Year 6 children to attend (a practice we have followed with class assemblies this year).
- -The opportunity to enable all school staff to attend who have been involved with supporting the children during their time from Reception onwards.
- -Allowing the children from the Year 2 'Partner' classes to attend as they have built up a strong relationship with the Year 6 children

With this in mind, invitations to attend the service will initially be offered to these different groups and we will review arrangements for our 2018 service in the light of this year's organisation.
