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Parents' Evenings

It was good to see so many of you at these sessions earlier this week and we hope you found your time in school useful. The partnership between home and school is vital in sharing information about progress (and the work needed to support this) and has a significant impact on a child's achievements.

Teachers issued a leaflet outlining the knowledge and skills that a child is expected to demonstrate by the end of the academic year, these are the standards that we report against in July. If you did not receive one of these, please contact the school office and we can arrange supply.

Parking

The school now has 420 pupils on site so the issue of parking and road safety becomes significant. The increased traffic on local roads is now greater than it was following the return of university students for the new term.

Please consider parking a distance away from the school and walking the remainder of the journey. If this is not possible, please park with the safety of our pupils and the consideration of local residents in mind.

Attendance

Our attendance figure for the first half term so far this year is 97.6%. A reminder that any late children are to report to the office and not the classroom doors as office staff must have an accurate picture of attendance each day. The figures for each class are below:

Only one session needs to be attended as it the same content for both, we would be grateful if current parents could pass this information onto those families who may be looking for a place here for the first time.

Site Safety

Please ensure that your child does not ride a scooter or a bicycle on the school site. The playgrounds and pathways get very busy before and after school and we want to avoid accidents. We would also appreciate vigilance on your part in ensuring that children are not climbing on any play equipment or railings at these times and, as we head into colder and damper weather, avoiding areas of decking as they can become slippery. A particular area of concern at the moment centres around the steps leading to Lodge Hill Road and the bank next to these steps. This gets very congested at the start and end of the day and this issue is being made harder to manage due to children climbing on or over the fences in this area.
