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Parents' Evenings

It was good to see so many of you coming along to these sessions this week and we hope you found the time useful. Teachers issued a leaflet outlining the knowledge and skills that a child is expected to demonstrate by the end of the academic year, these are the standards that we report against in July. If you did not receive one of these, please contact the school office and we can arrange for a copy to be provided.

Attendance

Our attendance figure for the first half term is 97.8%. A reminder that children arriving after 9.00 are to report to school reception and not the classroom doors as office staff must have an accurate picture of attendance each day. The current figures for each class are below:

Attendance patterns for individual children are monitored closely and we contact parents where attendance has fallen below 95%. This is intended to establish the reasons for absence and to offer support if needed.

The school uses the 'Fast Track' legal procedure for tackling cases of persistent absenteeism (this is where a child's attendance is less than 90%). This process can ultimately end with penalty notices being issued to parents/carers (3 of these have been issued to families of children at this school in the past 12 months).

Please note that leave or holiday in term time can only be authorised in the most exceptional of circumstances and only when this has been agreed with the Headteacher in advance. Any leave which falls outside these definitions will be deemed unauthorised and will impact on the overall attendance figure for the child.

Safeguarding

The school takes its safeguarding duty seriously. If you have any concerns about the safety or well-being of a child, then you must contact the school or the Birmingham Children's Advice and Support Service (CASS) on 0121-303-1888 in confidence.

Admissions to Reception and Year 7 (2020)

If your child is currently in Year 6, the deadline for applications for a secondary school place (Year 7) is **31**st **October 2019**.

If you have a child due to start school in Reception 2020 (i.e. they were born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016) please note that the deadline for applications is **15th January 2020.**Open sessions for admission to St Mary's in September 2020 will be held on <u>Thursday 7th November and Thursday 14th November between 9.30 and 10.45.</u>
