### **Parents' Evenings**

We will not be able to hold these in their usual form due to the restrictions currently in place regarding visitors to the school building.

Instead, you will receive a telephone call from your child's teacher which will focus on how well your child has settled in since returning and their current progress. You will also have the chance to identify any particular areas that you would like to raise with their teacher in advance of this. These consultations will take place in November and further details will be shared with you before the half-term break about booking details.

#### **Attendance**

Our attendance figures for the first month of the school year compare very well to the national picture. As explained in previous letters, we are vigilant in making the school as safe as it can be in the current climate and it is great to see the children in school regularly and catching up on lost time despite the worries and concerns that we all have.

Please note that regulations about leave or holiday in term time have not changed. They can only be authorised in the most exceptional of circumstances and only when this has been agreed with the Headteacher in advance.

#### **Harvest Donations**

As explained in the last newsletter, we will be unable to hold Church services for the foreseeable future but will be producing virtual celebrations in place of those we cannot share in person.

Something which remains unchanged is our tradition of asking families to contribute towards our Harvest appeal.

#### Site Safety

A reminder of the ways in which we can reduce the risk to all who use our school site at the beginning and end of the day. **Please protect other children and adults by:** 

- -Arriving as close to your drop-off/collection time as you can (this reduces mixing of parents and children from different year groups).
- -Only having one parent or carer on the premises.
- -Asking older siblings from other schools not to enter the premises.
- -Keeping your distance from adults who are not in your household. Face coverings are permitted if you are unable to maintain distance between yourself and others.
- -Keeping your children with you so they are not playing and mixing with other children from other year groups.
- -Making sure that children are not using play equipment as this will have been cleaned in readiness for the day.
- -Avoiding face to face contact with members of staff and instead contact them via teacher.info@stmryb29.bham.sch.uk.

This mailbox is monitored regularly throughout the day and messages will get through to them quickly.

-Leaving the site as soon as possible to reduce congestion on pathways, the playground and the pavements outside.
