# **Attendance**

In the past, they have funded new climbing equipment in the playground, an electric piano and playground games with all money raised going directly towards making the children's experience of school better.

#### Making a difference

The school has had a longstanding relationship with WHOlives (WHOlives.org) in raising funds for the construction of water pumps in places where these are desperately needed.

Our Year 6 pupils have traditionally got involved with this as part of their learning project in the Spring term and our recent Year 6 children did some wonderful work in generating funds to support a specific project in Uganda. They were so successful that they have been in a featured article in the latest WHOlives newsletter which is reproduced below. Well done to all.

#### What happens when Year 6 students in the U.K. learn about the contaminated water that plagues millions?

St Mary's Primary School has been a champion of our mission for many years. This year the Year 6 students made cakes for a bake sale during the coronation and raised over \$1,300 USD for a village called Buryanti and its 343 students who were missing school due to sickness from drinking stagnant pond water.

#### Over 300 students needed clean water

The school and the general community in Buryanti collected water from a surface pond. This dirty and contaminated water was all they had, so they used it for all purposes, including drinking and bathing. Lack of safe water in the village has kept most households in poverty and suffering for many years.

Typhoid fever is a bacterial disease spread by drinking or eating contaminated water. Typhoid was rampant in Buryanti. St. Mary's Primary kids put a stop to typhoid by raising the funds for a new well with a handpump.
