### Welcome

On behalf of all staff in school, a very warm welcome back as we look forward to the excitement and challenges that a new school year brings.

The term has started smoothly and the children have settled into their new classes well. A particular welcome to children and families who have joined us this week, we look forward to getting to know you and working with you over the coming years.

We also welcome Miss Domagala and Miss Bushnell to St Mary's, they will be teaching Reception and Year 1 classes respectively. We trust that their time with the school will be happy and successful.

## **Summer Projects**

We have made several improvements to the building and grounds during the summer break.

- -The playground on the Lodge Hill Road side of the site has been landscaped with larger areas designed for children to sit and talk with their friends.
- -There is a new bicycle and scooter shelter (close to the Reception outdoor area) for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children to use. As explained earlier, this has been provided by funds raised by FOSM. Years 3 to 6 will use the existing shelter.
- -The Reception and Year 1 classrooms have been redecorated along with the space outside the hall and the hall itself.

Many thanks to Mr Wright for managing these projects over the summer period and to his team of cleaners for making the school look attractive ready for the new year. We hope you see the positive impact of these changes, they have greatly enhanced the school environment.

Some classrooms have been relocated with some entry and exit points changing:

- -Reception and Year 1 classes remain unchanged.
- -Robins, Bluebirds and Starfish classes via the doorway next to the canopied area.
- **-Dolphins** via the door that leads directly onto the playground.
- -Giraffes and Lions remain unchanged although they have swapped rooms.
- -Tigers via the door used by Years 5 and 6 last year.
- **-Monkeys** via the doorway by the spider-web climbing frame on the Frederick Road side of the site.

Last year was a very successful one for FOSM with the whole calendar of events being very well supported. The new bicycle and scooter shelter paid for with the funds raised is now in use and there is an exciting programme of activities taking shape, starting with our 'Dahlicious' evening on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September. This does create a vacancy which we would like to fill at the AGM which will be held in school before half-term. # **School Organisation**

We will maintain the way the school is organised in the light of the increased number of pupils and the need to resolve any concerns as quickly and effectively as possible. Year groups are organised into phases, each led by a member of the school's leadership group (they are named in brackets):

Phase 1: Reception and Year 1 (Mrs Shore)

Phase 2: Years 2 and 3 (Mrs Fage)

Phase 3: Years 4, 5 and 6 (Mr Tromans)

Any concerns should be addressed in the first instance with the class teacher, in most cases a short discussion should resolve these. If a resolution has not been reached, please contact the designated phase leader who will then work with you to find a solution. If the concern has not yet been resolved after this stage then please contact a member of the school's senior leadership (either Mrs Joel, Mr Warland or Mr Smith).

Please use this procedure if you have a concern so members of staff closest to your child on a day to day basis can deal with issues as they arise and further difficulties avoided.

Please do not approach or contact school staff through personal social media or email addresses as this has the potential to place the school, the member of staff concerned and the person making the contact in breach of the safeguarding practices we have here. ### **Collective Worship and Assemblies**

As the school approaches the final phase of its transition to 420 pupils, we are anxious to preserve the special ethos of older children and younger children coming together as a community. Consequently, we have reorganised assemblies so we have a range of ages present in each rather than the older/younger children groupings of last year. The classes have been organised into two groups (each still to be named by the children) and are as follows:
